## **SEND Inspection Framework**

Warwickshire has been selected as one of the local areas across the UK to take part in a pilot to support Ofsted and CQC to develop a new SEND inspection framework.

Warwickshire will pilot the new inspection framework to inform its development and provide feedback on the methodology. As part of the pilot, the inspectors will follow their new draft framework to help to inform future inspections.

Ofsted and CQC have identified the features of effective local SEND arrangements from research, previous inspection evidence and consultation with children, young people, families, leaders, and practitioners. During the pilot, inspectors will evaluate the impact for children and young people and how the local area partnership work together to plan, evaluate, and develop the SEND system.
