# OXHILL WELCOMES THE GREAT SHAKESPEARE RIDE 2014 AUGUST 17

On Sunday 17th August cyclists will make their way through Oxhill as part of the 40 mile route of The Great Shakespeare Ride.

The ride is in aid of The Shakespeare Hospice and attracts hundreds of cyclists every year from all over the country. Last year the event raised £35,000 to help provide care and support to families in need of Hospice care in South Warwickshire and the North Cotswolds.

Starting from Stratford Manor Hotel at 9am, the ride also offers longer sportive distances of 100 miles and 100 kms for more proficient cyclists who are looking to test their legs on our challenging hills. The much flatter 40 mile route has been introduced for the first time in 2014, to give beginner or less experienced cyclists the chance to take part in a mass cycling event while supporting and raising sponsorship for their local Hospice.

#### GARDEN CLUB ACTIVITIES REPORT

I write this immediately upon my return from the gardens of Sezincote near Morton-in-the-Marsh. Entry to the grounds is from the A34 and a half mile drive leads one to the mature oak studded pastureland recorded in the Doomsday book and which gives the estate its name. Entry to the gardens is across the Indian Bridge with bronze effigies of Brahmin bulls on the parapets and stunning views below of unusual shrubs and trees – some in flower but all linked harmoniously by foliage form and colour.



The house and grounds were closed to the general public on this particular day (Wednesday 16th July) and we were privileged to have the place to ourselves apart from one other party - this 'double booking' resulted in our getting a half price concession! A guided tour of the main parts of this unique 18th century Mogul / Indian style house beautifully restored in the 1940s brought to light a succession of large paintings, rare artefacts and beautiful pieces of furniture. Regrettably none of the latter was available to sit upon! Décor was in the renaissance style with ceilings, drapes and hangings being particularly noteworthy.

We exited the house through the main dining room with its lovely murals onto the terrace / South Garden with its canals (lily ponds!) and Irish yews. Mature bush fuchsias were in full bloom and a trip through the curved orangery revealed a number of exotic climbers – as well as much needed bench seating! The twenty six of us then dispersed throughout the grounds and very much enjoyed the rest of a warm and sunny afternoon.

A lack of chairs was specifically not a problem at the Garden Club's annual party held Thursday 19th June at Sue and Alan Hedley's house. Their beautifully tended garden was filled with a profusion of flowers and plants of every description living in perfect harmony – there was not a square inch of bare ground to be seen! The hum of bees of every variety filled the air and we were treated to a lovely spectacle brought about by much hard work.

Proceedings were started by Jill Tucker with a minute's silence for remembrance of Ruth Gibson and a blessing for the wonderful spread of food put on / prepared by various individuals supervised by Sue and Martin Hunt. Chimeras and pagodas had been provided for warmth and shelter respectively for the seated cold buffet meal, but a fine evening meant that they were hardly necessary. Thank you so much Sue and Alan for a lovely evening amongst friends.

#### IN MEMORIAM

Ruth Elizabeth Baker was born on 1st July 1943 in Leicester. A baby sister for Ann who was three and half years old.

In a couple of years the family moved to Burton Latimer near Kettering and then in 1947 moved to Northampton. Ruth started school at Cedar Road, moving to Barry Road and after taking the 11 plus she went to Northampton School for Girls.

On leaving school she attended Southlands Teacher Training College in Wimbledon.

Ruth's first teaching post was in Eastfield School in Northampton. After her marriage to Sid Gibson in May 1966 they moved to

Solihull where Ruth taught at Eversfield and then at Catherine-de-Barnes.

When Sid moved his work to Stratford-On-Avon, they lived in a new build in Back Lane Oxhill which they called the Pippins. However, they always wanted an older property and when what is now known as Apple Tree Cottage came up for sale they managed to purchase it, and in due time made a great deal of improvements. This was when Ruth started to teach at Tysoe under the headship of Reginald Gethin. After a number of years at Tysoe, Ruth decided to retire. However this

could not be as her marriage broke down and she had to find work again. It was at this time that she worked for a few months at Tysoe Medical Centre. Unfortunately, although she had been left the house, she still had to maintain it and pay all bills and this was when she went to teach at The Croft in Stratford.

Ruth was very fond of all types of music (the family thought shoe took after her late Uncle who was the Director of Music for all the schools in Rockaway, New Jersey, USA). When she first moved to Northampton she was in the Junior Choir in Church and then in the Bach Choir. On moving to Solihull she was in the Gilbert and Sullivan Society and then one of the longest serving members. She played and taught the piano, played the Clarinet, the Steel Pans and recently started to learn the ukulele. She also played the organ at three local churches when the resident organist was away.

She was very fond of concerts at Symphony Hall, The Opera from the Met. At the cinema in Stratford and attending concerts at Longborough and Adderbury to name a few. Ruth was a member of the local Gardening Club, on the rota for Church flowers and a member of U3A and NADFAS.

Ruth and her sister Ann were very close and for the last 14 years they have enjoyed holidays to far flung places round the world.

She was a very treasured sister and from the gathering at her funeral it is obvious what a wonderful friend she has been to many.

#### Saturday 13th September 2014

The annual cycle ride, or Ride and Stride is the main fundraising event of the Warwickshire and Coventry Historic Trust, an interdenominational charity which has given many tens of thousands of pounds to churches and chapels in our county and has made a substantial grant to the restoration project at St. Lawrence's church.

There are about 300 churches in Warwickshire which need our support. The cost of looking after them is high and many are listed buildings. They receive no government funding, unlike in other European countries.

Surveys show that 86% of the population visit a place of worship during the year, for worship, a celebration, a cultural event, or for peace and stillness in an increasingly hectic world.

You don't need a bike to participate, walkers and horse riders can join in too. Jim Saxton is leading a triangular walk from St. Lawrence's church visiting St. Mary's church, Tysoe and St. Peter's church, Whatcote en route (see next month's Weekday Walkers). A list of other churches in the area that will be open, along with a route map, will be available for cyclists. We also need a rota of villagers who can be in the church between 10am and 6pm to welcome visitors, register their visit and provide light refreshments.

#### YOUR COMMUNITY ORCHARD

The picking season has started early this year, almost 4 weeks earlier than last year, and after just over two weeks we have picked an enormous amount of summer raspberries and

some gooseberries. The weather has been good and the fruit seems to ripen before your eyes! Members are benefiting already from the harvest as are the care homes, elderly and infirm in the area.

The bees are doing well and we have our third hive installed. A swarm was spotted on the fence next to the sensory garden and it was successfully captured along with the queen. They have settled in well and are now off foraging!



The "Wellies and Watering" picnic was a great success! Hot and sunny so just perfect for sloshing lots of water round the trees, then the fun of picking some raspberries and having lots of cake and sandwiches washed down with squash. Great to use our own honey and jam in the sandwiches!

We sowed poppy seed earlier in the year to create a strip of flowers to commemorate World War I and all who took part. They started to flower a bit

earlier than hoped but will continue for some time and the effect has been beautiful.
